FAUTE DE MOYENS, on aura au mieux les uns, les unes et tous les autres consists of a collaborative exhibition of an ad hoc collective composed of 15 artists with diverse practices and experiences that will be presented in May 2019 at GHAM & DAFE, the dissemination space of the organization "Espace Sud-Est" located in Hochelaga-Maisonneuve. Each artist will have access to a day in the gallery for an intervention in the exhibition space. The 15 interventions will take place from May 1 to 15 and will lead to a multi-referential exhibition that will be open to the public for a period of 2 weeks, from May 16 to 31.

This project involves trusting in the potential of cooperative creation and will include artists who raise, in their respective practices, the problems of collective creation, the status of the artist, and the need for a space for experimentation where uncertainty and risk are put on a pedestal.

GHAM & DAFE is a space for the dissemination of art that is managed by the non-profit organization "Espace Sud-Est". Founded in 2015, the space combines the venue as well as artists studios. The organization's mandate is to examine the founding principles of the artistic and local communities. Through its exhibitions, G&D presents works that put into practice the notions of collaboration, interaction, belonging, and commitment.

As sex workers, we face daily stigmatization and discrimination. In the eyes of a self-righteous society, we are seen as either harlots or victims that are incapable of making informed choices. Our community is marginalized and made invisible, and we face several forms of oppression (sexism, racism, classism, transphobia, etc.) The goal of this presentation is to sensitize the greater public to sex work, our struggles, and our human rights.

*Stella, l'amie de Maimie* is a Montreal-based feminist community organization by and for sex workers. Our mission is to improve the living and working conditions of sex workers. Our team visits the women at their workplaces, receives them at our office, and offers support, references, and accompaniment according to the needs expressed by the person involved. We also offer community activities for sex workers at our premises as well as in prisons. In addition, we offer training activities for students, professionals, and our other partners. We campaign for the total decriminalization of our work.
